



Re: Addressing your concerns about travel to Cuba in light of Venezuela strikes

On January 3, 2026, U.S. military forces launched an operation in Venezuela, targeting multiple military sites with air strikes and capturing Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro along with his wife, Cilia Flores, to face trial in New York on drug trafficking and narco-terrorism charges.

We understand your concerns regarding the recent developments surrounding the U.S. actions in Venezuela and their potential impact on your upcoming trip to Cuba.

The circumstances of the US operations in Venezuela relate to oil and criminal allegations against Venezuela's leadership. It is important to note that these factors do not pertain to Cuba.

Currently, there are no indications that the US intends to conduct military operations in Cuba, and the situation there remains stable. Protests in Cuba, while they may occur, are typically localised and do not pose a threat to tourists. The Cuban government held a rally to condemn US actions and show support for Venezuela but it is unlikely that anti-US sentiment in Cuba would impact visitors.

Airspace over the Caribbean has reopened, and we do not expect further disruptions to flights due to US operations.

There are no indications that tourism in Cuba will be significantly affected by the situation in Venezuela, including if oil shipments cease, however we are in constant contact with our local office and will provide updates should the situation change. Cuba remains a safe and welcoming destination.
